JAKARTA

The 132m tower is located at the center of Merdeka Square. It was first opened to public in 1975. It was built to commemorate the struggle for Indonesian independence. It opens throughout the week from 8AM-3PM except for the last Monday of the month.

Spanning 1.3sqm across North & West Jakarta, it was the reminiscent of the vicinity and once posed as popular urban center & center of commerce in Asia during the colonial times in 16th century. It is also home to several important historical sites



"KOTA TUA"

This archeological, historical, ethnological and geographical museum is popularly known as Gedung Gajah (Elephant Building) after the elephant statue in its forecourt. It contains broad collections of almost all of Indonesian historical items



"NATIONAL MUSEUM"

First established in 1820 when Jakarta used to be Batavia, all stores within the shopping complex were built in Chinese and European architectural influence. These days people go there to purchase traditional medicine, furniture, antiques, fabrics and many more. In addition to that, Pasar Baru is also home to various local delicacies.

"MONAS (NATIONAL MONUMENT)"

First established in 1962, it spans across 300-hectare land. It provides non-stop entertainment, variety of sporting and leisure facilities including shopping center. Their prime attractions include Art Market, Sea World, Gelanggang Samudera & Gelanggang Renang (Water Park) - a complex of slide pools & artificial beach
